

WHEN GOD “BEFRIENDED” US...

Social Media is a big part of our lives these days. It even has given Christmas a different dimension. You can send Christmas digital greetings and cards to the personal phones/devices of other people. You buy Christmas gifts right from your phone, and even do audio/video calls to converse with family and friends in other parts of the world. It seems that Social Media gives Christmas more hype. We feel in touch with people right from our finger tips. You might think, "How did a person in the past make any significant connection with others without the convenience of Social Media?"



Typically the Christmas season is a time when Christians celebrate the incredible true story that is foundational to their faith... that God entered human history by being born as a child and then growing up as a man and dying a designated death to accomplish His Divine purpose. But this story started in seeming obscurity with just a few people and God. However, it is full of numerous connections with exact timing between people that made this magnificent story come to pass. Just think now, two millenniums later, there are millions upon millions of people who are sharing this story. It all speaks to us that God is the ultimate connection point behind people and events in history. With this in mind, let's consider the Nativity story!

First, God connects people from the past to reassure people in the present. This was not some coincidence or afterthought. The Lord let us know ahead of time about His coming through prophets of old. One in particular was Isaiah (7:14; 9:6), who foretold some 700 years in advance that a child would be born through a virgin, and they would call His name, Immanuel, meaning **God with us**.

Then there is the connection God made between the two main characters, Mary and Joseph. The circumstances surrounding their relationship seemed an unlikely connection. An honorable young man became engaged to a young virgin who ended up becoming pregnant in an extraordinary way. Probably the news of this in their local town caused people to “unfriend” them.

But to encourage this young lady, who was bewildered at this announcement, an angel of the Lord told her the news that even her cousin Elizabeth, who was old and barren, was now also pregnant with child. Mary traveled to connect with her, with the hope of finding Elizabeth pregnant in order to be reassured in her own situation. Isn't it interesting how God connects people going through similar difficulties at the right time to bring each other hope and support?

We cannot forget how God linked some rough and lonely shepherds to the main characters in the story. It happened when Mary gave birth to this special child, an angel of the Lord came to the shepherds and announced the good news that hope and salvation would come through this child for all people. These men, who often were withdrawn from society, heard this news and went straight to Bethlehem to see the child. Upon witnessing this event, they went out and made connections with people by letting them know what had happened.

Though there are many others we could mention, let me address one more...the wise men. They probably were not your typical religious persons of the day. They searched and studied the stars and manuscripts to find answers. God connected them to Mary, Joseph and the child Jesus, through a star in heaven that pointed to this special event. This took them on a journey which brought them to meet the Christ child face to face, give Him gifts and worship Him. We do not know how much, but I would not be surprised that this particular connection created hundreds, if not thousands, of connections with people.

Today we continue to share in this connection through the work of Christ, the power of the Holy Spirit in us, the Word of God and prayer. May the Lord use us this season to share this wonder relationship with others.

"...I bring you good news of great joy which will be for all the people; for today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2:10-11)

Perspective & Focus:

- We value connecting the church in the workplace by seeking out other Christians, to mutually show our love for one another and our care for the people God has placed around us (John 13:35).

- Connecting ministry to God working through you to influence the people and circumstances of work.
